Our Mission

The mission of the Haddonfield Public Schools, working in partnership with families and the community, is to develop the unique potential of each individual by creating a challenging and diverse learning climate that promotes the development of the whole student and prepares students with the knowledge and skills to meet life's challenges and enrich their community.

Community

- Located in Camden County, New Jersey seven miles east of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania
- Suburban residential—Population of 12,000
- Population is comprised of business leaders, executives, and other professionals, with an above-average socioeconomic level
- Comprised of single-family homes with little in the way of industry

Student Involvement

- **Athletics:** 26 athletic programs with 50 total teams; 81% of students participate in interscholastic athletics
- **Extracurricular Programs:** 65 different clubs and activities; 40% of students take part in music and drama, while 85% are involved in extracurricular programs
- **Service To Others:** National Honor Society, Peer Leadership, Peer Mentors and Peer Tutors as well as a number of clubs enable students to develop leadership skills while providing support

Recognition – Academic

- In 2018 *US News and World Report* ranked Haddonfield Memorial High School 25th in the state and 597th in the nation. *New Jersey Magazine* ranked HMHS as 6th in the state.
- *South Jersey Magazine*'s September 2016 issue ranked HMHS #1 in SAT scores, percent of students attending a 4-year college, and graduation rate. Haddonfield was also ranked #2 in Student-to-Faculty ratio.
- *US News and World Report* named Haddonfield Memorial High School 15th in State and #275 in the Nation in 2014.
- *Philadelphia Magazine* has cited Haddonfield as one of the finest schools in the Philadelphia region on multiple occasions.
- The US Department of Education rated HMHS a Blue Ribbon School in 2004.

Recognition - Athletics

- The *Courier-Post* newspaper consistently ranks HMHS first overall in all of South Jersey in their annual Top 20 Varsity Sports rankings—
- 15-time winner of the Shop Rite Cup, awarded to the school having the highest overall achievement among all Group II athletic programs in New Jersey. HMHS has won every year since its inception.
- Winner of the Colonial Conference All-Sports Award, given to the one school in the conference with the best win-loss record each year for all sports. HMHS has won this award for 39 years - since its inception.
- Haddonfield Athletic Program was ranked #8 in the country on the 2017-2018 MaxPreps standings.

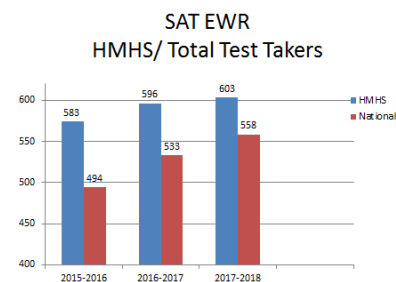
AP Scores

In the 2017-2018 school year, 218 students took 441 exams in 22 subjects

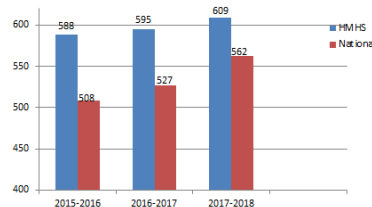
- 87% earned 3 or higher
